## A Year Full of Blessings

Thank you to our FBCS family for your continued support! We have just completed year #51 at FBCS! The school year started with a slight enrollment increase of ten students for a total of 223 students. The numbers were added primarily in the secondary level. In secondary (grades 11-12), our school entered into an agreement with Faith Baptist Bible College to begin to teach college-level courses live on our campus. Beginning with Bible, these Honors courses were taught along with general education courses (PSEO) online from the University of Northwestern at St. Paul. These dual-credit courses were made available to students who qualified academically. About 13 students took part in the program this year and it was a hit! We are hoping to offer live general education courses in the near future. This was the biggest program change of the year.

The school also raised funds to complete work in our gymnasium. New bleachers were purchased for the west side of the gymnasium, adding significant seating. Now, we will have enough seating for the state tourney and for well-attended home games.

In sports, the Warrior teams were in the MACS state championship game three times: Girls Varsity Volleyball, Girls Varsity Basketball and Boys Varsity Basketball. Both girls' teams lost in their state final games, but the Boys Varsity Basketball team won their first State title since 2007! Girls Soccer competed in a second spring season and our boys entered a co-op agreement in baseball.

One of our graduates was an exchange student. Dekangyan (Kevin) Chen from China was with us for both his junior and senior years. Many had been at FBCS since K4 or K5. It has been a delight to watch these students learn and grow over the years.

The ceremony began as junior flag-bearers Jason French and Benjamin Koestner brought the American and Christian flags to the platform and Pastor Matt Morrell, Mr. Alan Hodak, and Pastor Jared Page took their places on the platform. The seniors filed in individually to "Pomp and Circumstance" played on the organ by Mrs. Melody Bruffey.

Mr. Alan Hodak gave the welcome and invocation. The Special Senior Awards were given—Valedictorian and Salutatorian—and honor cord recipients were asked to stand and be acknowledged. The seniors then took their seats on the front pew as we all enjoyed the "Senior Slideshow Memories" - their expressions and thanks to God, family and those who helped them along the way, created by Mrs. Kristen Mulnix. Greta Smith then gave the Salutatorian Address, a humorous look at the senior class as a "family." This was followed by the Senior High Choir singing "This Is My Word," and then David Murray gave the Valedictorian address, a serious charge to the class to lead by serving.

Six of the seniors graduated with a GPA of 3.4 or higher, signified by the gold honor cords they wore. Both our Valedictorian, David Murray, and Salutatorian, Greta Smith earned GPA's of 3.85+. (FBCS grades on the 100 point scale, which means that a report card with all A's does not necessarily translate to a perfect 4.0, unless all the A's are 100's. Our method is a more accurate reflection of the student's performance, and colleges take note.)

We congratulate you, class of 2017, and we will pray for you as you follow God's leading in your lives. ☺

Choir Tour happened mid-march and 51 high school students went to the Chicago area to perform. The highlight of the trip was a performance at the Pacific Garden Mission in downtown Chicago. This was a life-changing experience for many of our students as they, for the first time, saw how hard life could be for people facing difficult circumstances, and how powerful God's Word is to turn those lives around. Students presented a concert to a full auditorium as onlookers were amazed at the talents of our group. One Pacific garden Mission employee said, "We have many different groups come through in a year and we have never seen our audience so engaged and respectful." Wow! God was using our students to minister and God used many of the testimonies of the folks at the mission to make our kids really think. This was a wonderful highlight to our school year.

David Murray, a senior student, qualified as a National Merit Commended student, a feat that only 3% of the students in the United States achieve annually.

We believe that God is preparing our school for some significant numerical growth as enrollment numbers are already beyond the previous years' enrollment at the same time. ## Track and Field Season Recap 2017

The good Lord saw fit to bless this year's track season by increasing student athlete participation. Our JH Track Team was 29 runners (11 boys and 18 girls) strong this year - just a little shy of 50% increase from last year. We were also blessed with and enjoyed unusually sunny and warm days for practices and meets. Practice commenced immediately after spring break and the program this year required the students to start endurance training immediately. Two weeks into the season, Pastor Jared Page came to train the athletes on the running long and triple jumps.

The season opened with a big meet at Calvin Christian for our 7th and 8th Graders. Several of our athletes placed in the finals.

Next, FBCS held our very first Annual Jr. High Track and Field Intramural Games. The athletes were able to run the 60M, 100M, and 200M dashes along with trying out their field skills in soccer kick and accuracy throw. It was a fun event for our athletes, and we saw overwhelming support by the parents, grandparents, friends and classmates. A big thank you to Mr. Hodak for approving this event, and also for Athletics Director/Coach Sarah Stephens for coordinating the logistics. The track team is tremendously grateful to the many parents, teachers and students who *sacrificially* gave of their time and donated food items. With God's gift of great weather

and your support, the event was a success!!

At the Granite City meet, the 6th Grade Athletes showed strong presence in their events - the chart at right summarizes their fantastic results. The darlings of this group consisted of Esther C., Daniel K., Kristy H., and Abbie P. These girls were so brave in their attempt at the 4x400 M Relay where they competed along with Sr. High Athletes. They placed 4th in this event - I am extremely proud of them!

Our 7th and 8th Grade Athletes also showcased their strength at Granite City. In the 400 M while competing against much older and more mature runners, our very own Isabel G. won 1st Place in this mid-distance event! Maddie H. and Lydia R. led our girls in securing several strong placements in multiple events. The combined 7th and 8th Grade Girls 4x100 Relay team ran with tenacity to finish 2nd place. This was an interesting meet experience for our Jr. High athletes this year in that they ran predominantly against Sr. High competitors. 
## 2nd Grade Visits Great Harvest and Mill City Museum



## 3rd Graders Spend a Day at the MN Zoo

# Welcome New Teachers!

First, we are excited about our current enrollment numbers and are expecting growth in our student count. As new high school enrollment numbers are coming in, it appears that we will be needing to add staff to accommodate size increases.

*We have contracted the following new teachers for the fall:*

K4 – **Miss Hannah Seest** – graduated from Maranatha Baptist University with a Bachelor’s degree in Elementary Education and a Master’s of Education degree. She comes to us with some excellent experience working with preschool-age children.

3<sup>rd</sup> Grade – **Mrs. Jody Faithfull** – is a 2003 graduate from Pillsbury Baptist Bible College and holds a degree in Elementary Education. Mrs. Faithfull brings four years of classroom experience to us and two children will become students at Fourth.

4<sup>th</sup> Grade – Many of our folks know **Mrs. Kris Gustafson** – mother of two current students, Jacob – (11th grade) and Greta (4<sup>th</sup> grade). Mrs. Gustafson holds a bachelor’s degree in Elementary Education from Bethel University. She also brings four years of teaching experience to our school.

Secondary Spanish and History – **Miss Emma Anderson** – a Maranatha Baptist University graduate holds a bachelor’s degree in Secondary Social Studies Education and a Master’s degree in Cross Cultural Communication. ## Summer Lexile Level Reading Challenge

Summer Reading Cards (5x7 size) were sent home with students on the last day of school with their Lexile level (now a range) as measured on the latest achievement testing we did in April. Please encourage your child to read this summer at their Lexile level and up to 50 points above that level. Write down the books they read with the number of pages and the Lexile level for that book. Lists of many common books for all ages with the book's Lexile levels have been compiled and are posted on the school website under the News & Info menu tab.

You can also purchase and download an app (called "Level It" for iphones) for your phone that will give a Lexile level for a book by scanning the barcode. Not all books will come up with a Lexile level, but many will. That can help when you are in the

library or in a bookstore looking for something in the correct range for your child. It is important to realize that many of current young adult/teen fiction books are written at a Lexile level below what it "should be" for that age/grade.

Classic literature generally has a higher Lexile level. Grades 7–12 students can get a jump on what they'll be reading in their literature classes next fall by reading those novels ahead of time over the summer. (They are noted on the website). Those books count towards the student's summer reading even if they don't quite match up to the student's current Lexile level. The "current Lexile Band" on the chart here shows an average of what a student's Lexile level generally is for a certain grade. - AF


## Save the Date!
