### How God Leads

Six years ago, the Lord led my family and me to Fourth Baptist Christian School. Two of our children have graduated from Fourth, and our third child is in eighth grade. We are thankful to God for bringing us here.



But the process of finding God's will for our lives was difficult. Having taught for many years, I know students and adults struggle with discerning what exactly God's will is for their lives.

In this issue, I would like to address what brought the Broere family to Fourth Baptist Christian School, as a means of encouraging you to both see God's will in play in your life and recognize what God is doing in and through Fourth Baptist Christian School.

The year was 2018, and we were at a Christian school in Chicago, and the senior pastor of the church had just left for another ministry. In many ways, our family felt that he held the ministry (church and school) together through his personality, his preaching, and his presence. But it was his absence that made the 2018-2019 school year feel different from previous years.

And it was in October of that year that my wife and I were discussing the school year and the struggles we had already

seen. I distinctly remember saying to her, "I am 75% certain we will not be here next year." While this statement wasn't intended to be prophetic, my wife realized my seriousness and began packing shortly afterward.

In the months that followed, I submitted 37 applications, was selected for 13 first-round interviews, visited five different campuses, and received two different offers. I didn't know then what God had in store for us and why the first 36 applications did not pan out.

#### ***But I know now.***

When we visited the Plymouth campus of Fourth Baptist Church and Christian School, I was reminded of the old campus in North Minneapolis, where I attended from kindergarten through 3rd grade. That old building was a literal maze, so much more complex than the two floors we occupy today. I rode a school bus for a few years, but there were plenty of students who walked to and from school each day.

But this Plymouth campus was so much different. Instead of a building with varied architecture from add-on after add-on, we have a consistent, clean look.

Instead of the tight, urban feel of North Minneapolis, you get the spaciousness of a suburban campus. Instead of tough inter-city neighborhoods, we are located in the relatively safe northwest suburbs of Minneapolis, with a newly paved Highway 55 (finally!).

We were impressed with the facility and the campus. Mr. Hodak was warm and welcoming. The staff were excited about the work in front of them. The students and families were positively interacting with each other and with the school staff.

As my wife and I walked from classroom to classroom that day, we saw:

- **Continuity** – from classroom to classroom, the staff interacted with students in similar ways
- **Care** – discipline was taken care of privately as often as possible; care was taken to separate the student and action
- **Connection** – teachers demonstrated real knowledge about the students in front of them

Those things stood out to us, and maybe you have noticed them as well.

The next night, Mr. Hodak hosted my wife and me, along with the rest of the pastoral staff. There were a few hard-hitting questions—it was an interview, after all. And there were some easy ones—Apple vs. Android. What impressed us was the easy way all of the church and school staff interacted with one another. The laughter lasted well into

the evening, and as we drove away, my wife and I knew this was where God wanted us to be.

Over the years, I have asked myself if Fourth Baptist Christian School was the best school we visited. No perfect school exists, just like there's no perfect job, house, or spouse. (If you're newlywed, you can ignore that last one). But we were not looking for *perfection*, we were looking for *progress*.

Every school must learn to grow, improve processes, and address weaknesses. We know Fourth has not arrived at perfection, and we seek to improve day after day. Thinking back to my time as a classroom teacher, I was determined to be 10% better every year. I wanted to improve and demonstrate to my students that adults can grow and change. I believe we must continue to change, day after day, year after year, to be what Christ wants us to be.

The Apostle Paul argues for a life of growth in Ephesians 4:15-16, where he says, "But, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ—from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love." Later, in verse 24, he continues by encouraging the believer to "put on the new man" which was created in God for us to attain towards holiness and righteousness.

Please be encouraged that God is still working in the Fourth Baptist Christian School Warrior family. As we continue to grow and change into His image, we will know what He wants for our lives, where we go, and what we do.

This 77-passenger bus is equipped with a gas engine, a 100-gallon fuel tank, and advanced safety features, including front and rear cameras. Its bright LED headlights and taillights ensure safe travel for our students on sports trips or field trips.

We are especially grateful to an anonymous donor whose generosity made this \$123,000 purchase possible. The bus has already proven its value on several recent sports trips, and we look forward to using it for many more adventures. ■




## Varsity Volleyball Season Recap





## Allyson Hodak's Obituary
