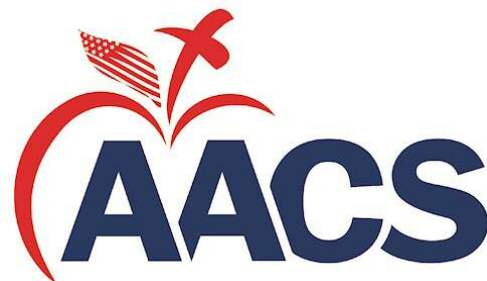
### The Value of Accreditation

Recently, I had the opportunity and privilege to sit on the accreditation team at Lake Region Christian School in Baxter, MN. Former FBCS Administrator and current MACS Executive Director Alan Hodak was chairing the team and asked me, along with three other Minnesota educators to be a part of his team. For three days, we worked through the accreditation process with LRCS. They were long days with a lot of work, but it was a really good process, and Lake Region did a great job. This was their third time through the process and I'm confident that they will have their accreditation extended for another five years. They are an outstanding school, and I learned a lot from them.

As I worked through this process at LRCS, I was reminded again of the value of accreditation. Our accrediting agency is the American Association of Christian Schools (AACCS). AACCS themselves had to go through an arduous process a number

of years ago in order to be a certified accreditor in the state of Minnesota. Accreditation at its root is a self-study.



Each school seeking accreditation evaluates itself according to a number of standards set forward by the accrediting agency. These cover the entirety of the school program: academics, extra-curriculars, finances and the physical safety of the property, to name a few. This forces the school to look at every area of what we do in detail. As the time for the accreditation visit draws near, the school submits their report and accompanying documentation for the visiting team to assess. Visiting teams are normally made up of fellow educators and are led by an experienced administrator, or someone from the AACCS home office.

The role of the visiting team isn't to sit in judgment over the choices that the school makes. It is to assess whether the school being accredited actually does what they say they do, and operates

according to its own philosophy and mission. The team's role is verification. They study the report presented by the school and seek to verify its contents. They pour over various documents, observe classroom instruction, conduct interviews with various constituents and examine the physical property of the school.

At the end of the process, the team presents a report evaluating all that the school has set forth. They can make commendations, recommendations, suggestions and observations, or point out areas where the school must improve or change in order to obtain or maintain accreditation. What emerges from the process is a school improvement plan (SIP), which the school being accredited can take and work on over the next term of their accreditation. This is a helpful guide for each school to better itself. Accreditation provides an accountability structure which serves to give its constituents confidence in what the school is doing. It is a lot of work, but it is a fruitful and necessary work, which helps ensure that the school is fulfilling its mission and leading its students well.



Fourth Baptist Christian School has gone through three rounds of accreditation, with the last round being completed three years ago. In each case, FBCS has received high marks and been commended in many ways. After our last accreditation visit, we received Accreditation with Merit, which is the highest honor that can be bestowed through AACSB accreditation. (You may have heard us say that we are "Accredited with Distinction" previously, but "Accreditation with Merit" is the new terminology AACSB uses.) It also allows us to go seven years between visits, which is really nice! This honor means that FBCS not only met but exceeded the standards for accreditation in a number of areas. We aren't perfect of course, and we continue to work through our school improvement plan to better ourselves. Accreditation is a hard, but valuable process, and we trust that by God's grace, it will help us continue to grow in our mission of partnering with families for excellent Christian Education. ■
